

- 3 On May 16, 1994 Fascinatin' Rhythm host Michael Lasser (pictured) and Audio Engineer Dave Sluberski made their way to the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel in New York City to receive a Peabody Award.
- ♠ In May 17, 2014 the RPO performed at Carnegie Hall for the 17th time, but the first in nearly thirty years. The RPO presented a concert production of Merry Mount, the only opera written by the late Howard Hanson, renowned composer and director of the Eastman School of Music. It was commissioned by and made its highly successful world stage premiere at NYC's Metropolitan Opera in 1934, and still holds the world's record for the most curtain calls—50—at that historic venue.
