It was in April 1991 that Lauri Dishman joined the WXXI Classical staff as Midday host and Music Director, presenting great classical music into 1995. She came to us from KSJR Classical in St. Cloud, MN, part of Minnesota's YOUR Classical network. April 21-24, 2016 WXXI presented a 3-day series of concerts throughout Rochester as part of *Pipedreams Live!* with host Michael Barone. WXXI has hosted *Pipedreams Live!* three times; first in 2009, then 2016 and most recently in November 2023. Rochester's faithful organ lovers packed the venues every time, and we are grateful to Eastman School of Music's organ department for partnering with us for each of these events. 2016 was also the year that WXXI Classical first presented the *Performance Rochester* initiative, sharing concert recordings from ensembles throughout Rochester during April. That small initiative has now grown into an annual series of programs called *Performance Upstate*, which includes concert recordings from all across upstate New York and the Finger Lakes region.
