On Thursday, March 29, 1979 your Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra under the baton of then Maestro David Zinman (1974-1985) performed "an interesting, well chosen program designed to showcase its newly acquired qualities" (NYTimes) at Carnegie Hall. The orchestra performed two virtuoso orchestral scores; Berlioz's "Benvenuto Cellini" Overture and Bartok's "Miraculous Mandarin Suite" and was also joined by noted pianist Misha Dichter. WXXI-FM 91.5 broadcast this concert live to air.

In 2014, WXXI FM 91.5 welcomed another renowned musician to Rochester, when flutist Sir James Galway performed with local and national musicians at Kodak Hall at Eastman Theater for a live broadcast of the nationally syndicated program "From the Top," that features talented young musicians.
