Etch This!



When microchips are etched, parts of the silicon wafer are removed to form a pattern of tiny circuits to allow the chips to process info and perform tasks.

Light It Up!



Visualize how energy moves through a closed loop circuit to see how electrical conductivity makes for an effective energy transfer.

Space Race!



Chip Kids race to place as many square chips as they can on a circular wafer and learn about space efficiency.

Microchip 3D



Learn to construct a model of microchip to better understand these tiny devices and their many layers.

Bending Light



Photolithography is a process used to print a specific pattern on a chip before etching use a special mask, which is like a stencil to print with light.

Diffusion



Learn about the movement of molecules from areas of high concentration to low concentration. See how it works in this exploration and applies to silicon wafers.

Keep It Clean



Explore how chemicals are used to keep microchips clean from dust and other tiny components during the manufacturing process.

The Philip Seymour Hoffman Award

This award honors the life and legacy of the late Academy Award-winning actor and Fairport native. It is given to the teen whose film is chosen by the judges as "Best of Fest."

Alex Ketchek Award for Best Animated Film

Presented in memory of Alex Ketchek, a 2010 Rochester Teen Film Festival finalist who tragically passed away in 2013. Presented by the Ketchek family and Animatus Studio.

The Jack Garner Award for Best Director

This award is presented in memory of long time Rochester Teen Film Festival jury member and beloved national film critic, Jack Garner.

The Marilyn O'Connor Award

Marilyn O'Connor has been fighting for equity and justice throughout her life – and this award goes to the film that best addresses a social issue through the lens of compassion.

WXXI Responds to Executive Order Targeting Public Media Funding – A message from WXXI President & CEO Chris Hastings



"WXXI Public Media remains fully operational and committed to serving the Greater Rochester community, following news that the White House has issued an executive order seeking to block federal funding for public media."

WXXI's Early Learning Work Continues Despite National Funding Cuts & CPB Statement

WXXI was among the stations that lost their national Ready To Learn funding. However, with local and state funding support we are able to continue our important Early Learning work for the community.

CPB statement: On May 2, the U.S. Department of Education notified the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB) that its 2020-2025 Ready To Learn grant is terminated, effective immediately. CPB then informed PBS and 44 public media stations in 28 states and the District of Columbia that receive Ready To Learn grants to stop work immediately, pausing the program in rural and urban communities throughout the country.

"Nearly every parent has raised their kids on public broadcasting's children's content. For the past 30 years, Ready To Learn-funded PBS KIDS content has produced measurable, real-world impacts on children's learning," said Patricia Harrison, President and CEO of CPB. "Ready To Learn has received strong bipartisan support from Congress for the last 30 years because of the programs' proven educational value in advancing early learning skills for all children. We will work with Congress and the Administration to preserve funding for this essential program."

Congress is also aware that public media offers a safe place for children to learn, protected from inappropriate content on commercial and social media – free of charge and commercial free.

New Leash on Life: The K9s for Warriors Story airs 5/11 at 3 p.m.—The documentary features the impact of service-dog agency K9s For Warriors on the lives of three American veterans struggling with trauma. Shilo and Louis with companion dogs. Each learns to manage issues such as flashbacks, hypervigilance and invisible psychological damage.

The Boys Who Said No! Airs 5/12 at 9 p.m.—Through dynamic archival footage and compelling interviews, this film is the first documentary to profile the youth-led movement of nonviolent civil disobedience against the Vietnam War, a critical part of the antiwar movement that eventually forced an end to both the war and draft conscription.

National Memorial Day Concert 2025 airs 5/25 at 8 p.m.—On the eve of Memorial Day, a star-studded lineup will grace the stage for one of the highest-rated programs on PBS.

<u>Defying Death on the Atlantic</u> airs 5/27 at 4 a.m.—William Fichtner narrates the harrowing story of four veterans competing in an extreme race to cross the Atlantic in a rowboat. They set out to raise awareness for veteran mental health, PTSD and veteran suicide, and when their boat capsizes, the team ends up fighting for their lives. With footage of the race, sinking life raft and miraculous rescue, **Defying Death on the Atlantic** is a story of hope, teamwork and healing.

Rudy and Neal Go Fishing airs 5/28 at 4:30 a.m.—Rudy and Neal Go Fishing is a documentary film about two guys going fishing in South Florida's beautiful waters. But it's not your ordinary fishing trip. Rudy is a U.S. Army veteran suffering from Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). Neal is a tournament angler with an unusual professional background. Fishing is part of Rudy's therapy. Almost 20 veterans with PTSD commit suicide every day in US
