



# A Special Preview of *The*American Revolution Classroom Collection is Now Available

Just ahead of Constitution Day, celebrated on September 17, explore a special preview of select resources from the upcoming *The American Revolution* classroom collection.

Introduce students to curriculum-aligned resources covering topics from the upcoming series, such as <a href="mailto:the">the</a>
<a href="Coercive Acts">Coercive Acts</a>, <a href="Thomas Paine's Common Sense">Thomas Paine's Common Sense</a>, and the impacts of military leaders <a href="Nathanael Greene">Nathanael Greene</a> and <a href="Joseph Brant">Joseph Brant</a>, also known as Thayendanegea. Resources include video clips, discussion questions, and suggested activities, and are designed to deepen students' understanding of the American Revolution and its legacies using the power of visual media.

The full collection will feature more than 35 media-rich classroom resources and topics will include life in the British colonies, causes of the Revolution, key events, key figures, and the consequences and legacies of the American Revolution. The collection will be released on **November 10**, just ahead of the broadcast premiere on **November 16**.

Watch <u>Lafayette: A Hero's Return</u>.on-demand. This educational initiative seeks to 'inspire students through the enduring story of Lafayette's patriotism, diplomacy, and commitment to democratic values'.

The 27-minute film is available on-demand and includes a discussion activity one-sheet to promote post-viewing discussion in the classroom.

This project is part of New York State's 250th commemoration, aligning with Lafayette's trek across New York State in 1825 on his way to Boston.

THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION examines how America's founding turned the world upside-down. Thirteen British colonies on the Atlantic Coast rose in rebellion, won their independence, and established a new form of government that radically reshaped the continent and inspired centuries of democratic movements around the globe. An expansive look at the virtues and contradictions of the war and the birth of the United States of America, the film follows dozens of figures from a wide variety of backgrounds. Through their individual stories, viewers experience the war through the memories of the men and women who experienced it: the rank-and-file Continental soldiers and American militiamen (some of them teenagers), Patriot political and military leaders, British Army officers, American Loyalists, Native soldiers and civilians, enslaved and free African Americans, German soldiers in the British service, French and Spanish allies, and various civilians living in North America, Loyalist as well as Patriot, including many made refugees by the war.

The Revolution began a movement for people around the world to imagine new and better futures for themselves, their nations, and for humanity. It declared American independence with promises that we continue to strive for. THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION examines how America's founding turned the world upside-down. October 13, 2025: A new episode titled "A New Friend" will introduce Paolo, a non-speaking autistic character who uses an Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) device. Carl connects with Paolo over their mutual interest in collecting things. This segment focuses on making connections and the value of shared hobbies.

"Lotta The Copycat": This new episode also airs on October 13, alongside "A New Friend". Nico initially thinks Lotta is making fun of her by imitating her actions, but she learns that Lotta has different reasons for what she is doing. The story explores themes of communication, perspective-taking, and understanding individual differences. Lotta is also autistic, and the episode highlights how neurodivergent people can express themselves in unique ways.

"A Fuzzytown Halloween": A 30 minute Halloween Special on October 16: Forrest the squirrel shares a rumor with everyone that Mr. Price is a wizard who turns kids into chicken noodle soup. Sheldon the beaver is determined to find the truth and debunk the spooky gossip to make sure everyone can enjoy the Halloween festivities. The Story's Lesson: Like all episodes of Carl the Collector, this Halloween special will likely reinforce positive social-emotional lessons. In this case, the story will explore themes of facing fears and challenging misinformation.



Many kids and teens use ChatGPT and other generative artificial intelligence models like Claude or Google Gemini for everything from dealing with math homework to coping with a mental health crisis, often with little to no guidance from adults. Education and child development experts say parents must take the lead in helping children understand this new technology.

"Having conversations now about what is ethical, responsible usage of AI is important, and you need to be a part of that if you are a parent," says Marc Watkins, a lecturer at the University of Mississippi who researches AI and its impact on education. La Recua: The Mule Train Pack airs 10/2 at 3 p.m. and 10/4 at 5 p.m.—It's all about cowboys, mules and desert trails... but it's so much more! Darío Higuera Meza, a traditional saddle maker in Baja California Sur, Mexico, turned 70 in 2018. In March that year, he traveled 200 miles in 20 days by mule-back, herding a pack train of donkeys from an oasis in the heart of the Sierra de la Giganta, all the way to the capital city of La Paz. Just for the sake of history! Fearing that the old traditions might be lost forever, he overcame hardships of health, rattlesnakes, and hot days on rocky, forgotten trails in order to honor the memory of Lower California's "long-haul" equine merchants — the muleteers of Baja's donkey pack-trains.





Tasked with organizing a huge backlog of undelivered mail intended for U.S. soldiers, the women, nicknamed the "Six Triple Eight," worked tirelessly in challenging conditions to ensure that millions of letters reached the frontlines.
