Indie Lens Pop Up returns February 2026

For more than 20 years, the award-winning Indie Lens Pop-Up program has partnered with local organizations across the country to bring people together for film screenings and community-driven conversations.

Inspired by the documentaries featured on PBS' *Independent Lens*, Indie Lens Pop-Up events strengthen community connections and provide free, public spaces for everyone to meet, talk, and take action.

Every season, partners host live, local events across cities and towns, suburbs, and rural areas, in nearly all 50 states. Since 2005, nearly half a million participants have come together to discuss issues that impact local communities.

Indie Lens Pop-Up events are free, community-based film screenings followed by discussions held at local venues like The Little Theatre. Films include:

- ***The Librarians***—Librarians across the U.S. examine how book review policies are shaping their communities (Scheduled In April at Central Library during National Library Week– Not at the Little Theatre)
- ***The Inquisitor 2/16 6:30pm*** Meet Barbara Jordan: a civil rights icon whose powerful voice masked a complex private life.
- ***Dwarf 3/30 6:30pm*** A filmmaker seeks belonging in the Little People community and explores dwarfism within her family.
- ***The Grocery List Show May 19, 6:30pm*** Top Chef contender Chrissy Camba takes us to five bustling international grocery store in America

[Revolution and Independence, 1754–1800](#)

As Great Britain increased regulation of its empire following the Seven Years' War, some colonists questioned overseas rule and called for revolution. By 1783, having gained independence, the leaders of the new United States created a national government that avoided both monarchy and direct democracy. Recognizing the flaws of the initial Articles of Confederation, Constitutional Convention delegates—a group of 55 white men—then crafted the first representative democracy, but ultimately left most Americans out of the political system.



Examine the causes and effects of several major events such as the initial settling of the 13 British colonies to the signing of the Declaration of Independence and how they led to the American Revolution.





Big Ideas for Little Kids: Teaching Philosophy Through Picture Books airs Sunday, January 11 at 11 a.m. on WXXI-HD

A diverse group of second graders at an urban charter school in Springfield, Massachusetts, learn to love books and reading as they argue about some of life's headiest issues using picture books as a starting point for their discussions. Philosophy is not usually part of a second-grade curriculum, yet this documentary accompanies a group of college students who lead a series of philosophy classes for six-and seven-year-olds. The second graders learn some of the basic rules for having philosophical discussion, from what it means to be a respectful listener who respects differences in opinion, to how to build a good argument when making a point. This film documents classes conducted at the Martin Luther King Charter School by Mount Holyoke College students under the guidance of Philosophy Professor Thomas Wartenberg and President Lynn Pasquerella. The goal of Wartenberg and Pasquerella's unique class is to give children an opportunity to pursue their natural curiosity and inclination for philosophy. In their curriculum, picture books become catalysts for philosophical discussion and an effective way to foster critical thinking skills as well as lifelong love of reading.



Coming in 2026

PBS KIDS announced the launch of two new animated series, **PHOEBE & JAY** designed to foster literacy skills for young viewers.

PHOEBE & JAY is a fun, new series for children ages 3-5 from Phoebe & Jay Productions and Mainframe Studios.

The show, which follows the adventures of the curiously charismatic 6-year-old fraternal twins, Phoebe and Jay Yarber, highlights a variety of texts that preschoolers encounter in their daily lives—from labels and signs to posters and more—to foster their early literacy skills and help them navigate the world around them.

In addition to new episodes, Phoebe and Jay's Dance Party game will debut on pbskids.org and the [PBS KIDS Games app](https://www.pbs.org/gamesapp) in tandem with the series launch. Created by Genie Deez and Thy Than, **PHOEBE & JAY** debuts on PBS KIDS February 2, 2026.

The series supports early literacy for preschoolers and kindergarteners through 7-minute action-packed stories that follow the adventures of the beloved Super Readers in the epic comic book world of Reader Valley. **SUPER WHY'S COMIC BOOK ADVENTURES** is produced by 9 Story Media Group and animated by the award-winning studio, Brown Bag Films

PBS KIDS points out that recent research has found a significant drop in U.S. children's reading scores and has shown that a large percentage of children are reading below grade level. *Super Why's Comic Book Adventures* features an early literacy curriculum that focuses on mastery to provide kids with the skills, knowledge and empowerment they need to become successful readers.





Introducing Jobs Explained – A Career Video Series for Youth



WXXI's Jobs Explained is a digital content initiative locally offered to educate and inspire young adults (ages 15 – 26) about in-demand career paths in **green jobs, manufacturing, and construction**. Through engaging short-form videos on platforms like Instagram and TikTok, we're giving a behind-the-scenes look at what these careers are really like—from the people doing the work every day.

This project is part of American Graduate: Jobs Explained, a national public media initiative led by The WNET Group and funded by the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB). WXXI is one of 10 public media stations across the country participating in this effort to help young people better understand today's workforce opportunities and career pathways.

What We Do:

- **150 Short-Form Videos** - Featuring real professionals, day-in-the-life stories, and skill-building tips tailored for youth (15-26)
- **Digital Outreach** - Targeted campaigns on TikTok, Instagram, and YouTube to maximize reach and engagement.
- **Community Partnerships** - Collaborations with career technical education (CTE) programs, community colleges and higher education, workforce development boards, youth and professional organizations, and employers to advise, support and participate in events and outreach.
- **Youth Voice** - Surveys, focus groups, and advisory roles conducted by professional evaluators ensure content stays relevant, authentic, and youth-driven.

Jobs Explained blends storytelling, social media, and community support to empower young people with real, local career insights.

Key Objectives / Impact

This initiative aims to inspire youth to explore in-demand, high-growth career sectors by breaking down stereotypes and raising awareness of often-overlooked career path options. Through accessible, relatable content, young people connect directly to training programs, apprenticeships, certifications, and job opportunities. By building sustainable partnerships between media, industry, and workforce development sectors, the project not only empowers youth with clear pathways to stable employment and upward mobility but also supports industries in meeting workforce demands with motivated, well-informed talent.


Special Programming Celebrating the Bicentennial of The Erie Canal

Completed in 1825, the Erie Canal was a marvel of engineering—the longest man-made waterway in the world and the most ambitious public works project North America had ever seen. It put New York on the map as a powerhouse, fueling explosive growth in population, industry, and economic dominance. It transformed Rochester from a remote town into a booming city by providing transportation and trade to the Midwest and the East Coast markets. To commemorate the 200th anniversary of the completion of the Erie Canal, WXXI is proud to bring you the following specials.

This film explores the past, present, and future of the canal. In 1825, the state of New York inaugurated a monumental economic engine - the Erie Canal. Marked Man: Martin Luther King and The FBI airs 1/26 at 12 a.m.—For years before Martin Luther King Jr.'s death, he was subjected to a campaign of intimidation by J. Edgar Hoover's FBI. Simon Schama: The Holocaust 80 Years On— airs 1/27 at 10:30 p.m. - Amid rising antisemitism around the world and 80 years after the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, Simon Schama traces the historical road of horror that culminated in the death camps. From Lithuania to Poland, the Netherlands and, finally, Auschwitz, Schama confronts the enormity of the Holocaust as both historian and 80-year-old Jew, to understand how it happened and in the hopes of never again.




